Our mission is to advance an efficient and effective regulatory system that supports medicine development, marketing authorization, access, and appropriate use of medicines. RSNN shares and disseminates knowledge among all stakeholders and sets the agenda for further research. A variety of activities support our mission. These include a yearly RSNN workshop around a topic that necessitates discussion or interest, and also scientific sessions during conferences such as FIGON Dutch Medicines Days. Alongside its meeting reports, the RSNN stimulates publication of relevant papers based on RSNN activities designed to stimulate national and international debate on regulatory science. Participants in the network receive news on developments in the field via our regular newsletters. The RSNN is an inclusive organization, with all activities open to anyone interested. Such inclusiveness helps us to set agendas for future research, and to act as a breeding ground for new research initiatives.
